Thank You for comforting us in all our troubles, so that we can comfort others. May it be so through every trial they face; may Your comfort overflow to them, and through them.
(2 Corinthians 1:3-5)

Rely on the Lord

Some are facing stress and pressures that are more than they can handle. Help them to know and accept that these things happen so that they might not rely on themselves, but on You, who can even raise the dead! Help them to believe that nothing is too hard for You to do. (2 Corinthians 1:8-9; Jeremiah 32:17)

Live by Faith

When they are hard pressed on every side, don't let them be crushed. When they are perplexed, don't let them despair. Keep them from losing heart. (2 Corinthians 4:8-9, 16)

Help them to keep their eyes on Jesus. May they set Him before them, for if He is at their right hand, they will not be shaken. Help them to fix their eyes not on what is seen, but on what is unseen. May they live by faith and not by sight. (Hebrews 12:2; Psalm 16:8; 2 Corinthians 4:18; 5:7)

Joyful in Hope

Father, through my prayers may these I pray for be given help by the Spirit of Jesus Christ, so that whatever happens will turn out for their good. (Philippians 1:19) I ask it for each of these I bring to You in prayer (name one or more)...

As hard as it is, help them to have joy in their trials, even though things are extremely difficult. Help them to accept that trials come to test our faith, which is more precious to You than gold. May their faith result in praise, glory, and honor when Jesus Christ returns. Though they can't see Jesus now, help them to believe in Him and love Him. Help them to be joyful in hope, patient in affliction, and faithful in prayer.
(1 Peter 1:6-8; Romans 12:12)

Strength and Endurance

When they are weary from their struggles, help them to acknowledge You as their Lord, the everlasting God, who never grows tired or weary. May they know You as one who gives strength to the weary and power to the weak. May they hope in You, for those who hope in You will renew their strength. (Isaiah 40:28-31)

Shine Your Face

May You, Lord Jehovah, bless them and keep them. May You make Your face shine upon them and be gracious to them; may You turn Your face toward them and give them peace. May they not fear, knowing You are with them. May they not be dismayed, knowing You are their God. (Numbers 6:24-26)

Overflow with Hope

Father, I offer these prayers for each of these You have given me to pray for today. Some are ill or injured and in need of physical healing; some need of spiritual or emotional healing. Many face difficult, seemingly impossible circumstances. All of them are in need of Your power and provision so they might live the abundant life Jesus promised. (John 10:10) Please hear my prayer for these who are hurting (name one or more)...

May You who are the God of hope fill them with all joy and peace as they trust in You, so that they may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit. (Romans 15:13)

Confidence in God's Plans

Help them to know You in a deeply personal way. You are our faithful God; may they experience Your faithfulness first-hand. Help them to love You, for when they love You and are called according to Your purpose, all things will work together for their good. (John 17:3; 1 Corinthians 1:9; Hebrews 13:5; Romans 8:28)

May they have confidence in Your promise that You know the plans You have for them, plans to prosper them and not to harm them, plans to give them hope and a future. (Jeremiah 29:11)

Be People of Prayer

Help them to be people of prayer, those who call upon You, for You have said You will listen when we do. May they live without hindrance to their prayers. May they seek You with all their hearts—for You have promised that You will be found by those who do. (Jeremiah 29:12; see: Isaiah 59:2; Psalm 66:18; Jeremiah 29:13)

Live by God's Word

Father, help these I bring before You today in need of healing to live according to Your Word. Help them not to be wise in their own eyes, but to fear You and turn away from anything evil—for You have said that this will bring health to our bodies and nourishment to our bones. (Proverbs 3:7-8) That's what I ask for each of them (name one or more)...

Help them to listen closely to Your words. May they keep them within their hearts, for Your words are life to those who find them and health to a man's whole body. (Proverbs 4:20-22)

Listen Carefully and Obey

How I thank You that You are the Lord Who heals us when we listen to Your voice and do right in Your sight. May they listen carefully to what You say and obey Your commands. Thank You that they do not have to obey in their own strength; help them rely on Yours. (Exodus 15:26)

May they be those who worship You as the Lord their God. You have promised that when we do, Your blessing will be on our food and water, and that You will take away sickness from among us and give us a full life span. It's a wonderful promise, Lord, given to Your people who choose to listen to You and do all that You say. Help them to live that way. (Exodus 23:25-26, 22)

Choose to Keep God's Commands

May they choose to keep Your commands in the strength of Your indwelling Spirit. May they trust You, God of peace, to sanctify them through and through. May You keep their spirit, soul, and body blameless. (John 14:15-17; 1 Thessalonians 5:23)

Keep the Faith

Father, I ask You to help these I bring before Your throne in every way to be clear-minded and self-controlled, so that they can pray. Above all, may they love each other deeply, because love covers over a multitude of sins. (1 Peter 4:7-8) I ask this for each of these who are in need of Your healing touch (name one or more) ...

Help them to throw off everything that hinders and the sin that can so easily trip them up. Help them to run with perseverance the race marked out for them. May they fix their eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of their faith. May they fight the good fight, finish the race, and keep the faith. Let there be in store for them the crown of righteousness. (Hebrews 12:1-2, 3; 2 Timothy 4:7-8)

Rejoice in the Lord

Help them to turn every worry and anxiety over to You with the confidence that You truly care for them. After they have suffered a little while, restore them and make them strong, firm and steadfast. (1 Peter 5:7, 10-11)

Help them to rejoice in You always. Help them not to be anxious about anything, but instead to turn to You in prayer about whatever they may be facing. Help them to pray with thankful hearts, and let Your peace, which is beyond understanding, guard their hearts and minds in Christ Jesus. (Philippians 4:4-7)

Be Content

May they learn to be content whatever their circumstances, whether well fed or hungry, whether living in plenty or want. May they do everything through You who gives them strength. (Philippians 4:11-13)
