
Lord Jesus, Son of God

I come to worship You, Lord Jesus, as my everlasting Father—You and the Father are one. You are the King eternal, immortal, invisible, the only God—to whom be honor and glory for ever and ever. You are King of Heaven, King of Israel, King of the Ages—the King of Glory, King of Righteousness, the King of Salem, King of Peace. (Isaiah 9:6; John 10:30; 1 Timothy 1:17; Daniel 4:37; John 1:49; Revelation 15:3; Psalm 24:7-10; Hebrews 7:2)

I exalt You as King of kings, Lord of lords. I stand absolutely amazed that You would choose to become the Son of Man, taking on the very nature of a servant, living life on earth as an example to us all of how we should live. (1 Timothy 6:15; Revelation 19:16; John 1:49; 2 John 3; John 1:51; Philippians 2:7; John 1:29; 1 John 2:2)

Worship and Exalt You

You are worthy of worship, for You are the great I Am—before Abraham was, You are. You are the living and incarnate Word, who was in the beginning, the Word who was with God, the Word who was God. (John 18:5-6; 8:58; 1:1)

I exalt You as the light of the world. You are the living water, and whoever believes in You will never thirst. You are the bread of life, and those who come to You will never hunger. You are our good shepherd, who laid down Your life for the sheep. You are the resurrection and the life, and whoever believes in You will never die. You are the way, the truth, and the life—and no one comes to the Father except through You. You are the true vine, and those who abide in You will bear much fruit for the Father's glory. (John 8:12; 4:10-14; 6:35; 10:7, 14-15; 11:25-26; 14:6; 15:1, 5, 8)

Holy Spirit

Blessed Holy Spirit, third person of our holy triune God, though You seek no recognition for Yourself, I come to worship You as my indwelling God. I exalt You as the Holy Spirit, my Comforter, my Counselor, my Advocate—the Helper Jesus promised to send. (John 14:16)

I magnify You as the Holy Spirit who is also the Spirit of the living God, the Spirit of the Lord—the Spirit of my Father. I extol Your name as the Spirit of Jesus, the Spirit of Christ, the Spirit of Jesus Christ—the Spirit of God's Son. You are the One through whom we abide in Christ and He and His words abide in us. (Genesis 1:2; Matthew 10:20; Romans 8:9; Philippians 1:19; Galatians 4:6; John 15:4-5, 8; 14:17)

Spirit of Truth and Life

I worship You as the Spirit of truth, the One who brings to mind all that Jesus said. You are the Spirit of wisdom and revelation, the Spirit of understanding, counsel and might, Spirit of knowledge and fear of the Lord. (1 John 2:27; John 14:26; Ephesians 1:17; Isaiah 11:2)

I exalt Your names. You are the Spirit of grace, the Spirit of glory, the Spirit of supplication and prayer. You are the oil of joy, the Spirit of adoption, Spirit of life. You are the One who convicts the world of sin and righteousness and judgment, the One who brings us spiritual birth. (Zechariah 12:10; Romans 8:26; Acts 2:3; John 3:8; Psalm 45:7; Romans 8:15, 2; John 16:8; 3:5-6)

I extol You as the promise who indwells us, the Spirit of power, of love, of a sound mind. You are the endowment of power from on high, the measure of all the fullness of God. You are the eternal Spirit, the gift of God. (Acts 2:38-39; 2 Timothy 1:7; Luke 24:49; Ephesians 3:19; Hebrews 9:14; John 4:10)

HALLOWING HIS NAME

Jesus said we should hallow God's name as part of our daily prayer lives (Matthew 6:10), and these prayers are filled with the names of God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit. May they enrich your personal worship.

Read the prayers just as they appear:

“You are our merciful God who hears prayer, a strong tower from the enemy...” (Isaiah 61:3, 65:2)

Use the prayers as an outline. Read only a sentence or two, enough to present a complete thought. Then add your own personal worship:

“You are our merciful God who hears prayer, a strong tower from the enemy...” (Isaiah 61:3, 65:2)

You might add something like—*“I exalt You as our God who is worthy of worship and praise!”*

May God be delighted with your prayers as you worship Him in spirit and in truth.

Our Father

Father, I come to You as *Abba*, my Father—for I am Your child by the Spirit of adoption. I come assured that I am Your child, having received Christ and believed in His name. You chose me before time began; You elected me, You predestined me to be Your own. (Romans 8:15, 14; John 1:12; Ephesians 1:11; 2 Peter 1:10)

I worship You as my Father because You drew me to Yourself, You enabled me to come, You rescued me out of the kingdom of darkness and brought me into the Kingdom of Your Son. (John 6:44, 65; Colossians 1:13)

I magnify You as my Father, knowing I have been born again—born of the Spirit—that my name has been written in the book of life and engraved on the palms of Your hands. I am Your child. Nothing can separate me from the love of Christ, nor from Your love that is in Christ Jesus my Lord! (John 3:5-6; Revelation 21:27; Isaiah 49:16; John 10:29, 28; Romans 8:38-39)

Amazed by Your Love

I worship You, amazed that I can call You Father—for when I was dead in my sins, You made me alive with Christ. Because of Your great love for me, because You are rich in mercy, I have been saved by Your grace and made Your child. (Ephesians 2:4-5, 8; Romans 12:3)

I come to You as my Father, knowing every good and perfect gift is from You, that You are my Father who desires to give me good gifts that are much more than any earthly father could give. You are able (and I've discovered, willing!) to give me exceedingly, abundantly above and beyond anything I can ask or imagine. (James 1:17; Matthew 7:11; Ephesians 3:20)

Blessed Holy Trinity

I worship You, blessed One in Three—You are One, yet You manifest Your presence as a perfect communion of three divine beings: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. (Ephesians 4:5; 1 John 1:3; 2 Corinthians 13:14)

I worship You, our triune God, whom John saw in his vision in the Revelation. He saw You on Your throne, surrounded by twenty-four thrones with elders upon them. Before Your throne He saw seven lamps blazing, the seven Spirits of God, the Holy Spirit. (Revelation 4:1-5)

Lord Jesus, I worship You as the Lamb of God, standing in the center of the throne—You alone are worthy to open the scroll. Around the throne are angels numbering ten thousand times ten thousand singing, “To Him who sits on the throne and to the Lamb be praise and honor and glory and power, for ever and ever.” (Revelation 5:6, 5, 7, 11, 13)

Creator and Maker

I exalt You as *Elohim* [el-o-HEEM] my Creator and Maker. God our Father, You spoke and the universe came into being. Lord Jesus, all things were created by You and for You and all things hold together in You. Holy Spirit, You are the One who hovered over the waters of creation and brought forth life. (Genesis 1:3, 6, 9, 14, 20, 24, 26; John 1:1-3; Colossians 1:16-17; Genesis 1:2)

I surrender to You as *Adonai* [add-eh-NYE], my Lord and Master, whom Isaiah saw seated on a throne, high and exalted. I join the seraphs in praying: “Holy, holy, holy is the Lord Almighty; the whole earth is full of His glory.” With Isaiah I hear, “Who will go for us?” and with him I cry, “Here am I—send me!” (Isaiah 6:1-8)

I praise You as the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of compassion and the God of all comfort. I worship You as *Jehovah*, the great I Am, and I revere You by Your *Jehovah* names (2 Corinthians 1:3; Exodus 3:14)—

Our Creator, and the Strength of Our Life,
(Isaiah 40:28; Psalm 27:1)
The Lord Most High, the Sword, Our Defense,
(Psalm 7:17; Deuteronomy 33:29; Psalm 89:18)
The Strength of Your People, Mighty in Battle,
(Psalm 28:7; Psalm 24:8)
The Lord Who Is with Us, Strong and Mighty,
(Judges 6:12; Psalm 24:8)
Our Redeemer, Our Judge, Our Glory, (Isaiah 49:26; Judges 11:27; Psalm 3:3)
The One Who Provides, (Genesis 22:14))
Our Shield, Our Fortress, Our King Forever,
(Deuteronomy 33:29; Jeremiah 16:19; Psalm 10:16)
Our Deliverer, Our Sanctifier, Our High
Tower, (Psalm 18:2; Exodus 31:13; Psalm 18:2)

You are our merciful God, our God who hears prayer, a strong tower. You are great and awesome, our God who does wonders—the strength of my heart and my portion forever. (2 Samuel 22:1-3; Psalm 59:10; 65:2; 61:3; 76:1, 12; 77:14; 73:26)
